WEST COVINA TO CELEBRATE VOLUNTEERISM WITH COMMUNITY SERVICE DAY


City of West Covina Launches New Web Site and Mobile Phone App

The City of West Covina has launched its new Web site. As one of the West Covina City Council's goals, the new site was created to be user-friendly, to promote transparency and to be informative.

The City of West Covina invites you to explore the new Web site. In addition to the new look, it has these new features:

- Community View/Geographical Information System ("GIS") – This system provides detailed information on properties and location information from a geographical perspective.

- OpenGov – This award-winning Web-based software provides access to the City's budget and finances. The public has convenient access to explore and share the City of West Covina's financial and budgetary information.




- New SIRE system – This is a new agenda management system by SIRE. This allows the public to search online for city council, commissions and committee meeting agendas, staff reports, agenda items and video clips.

The City of West Covina's new Web site also offers online services, service requests, e-notifications, more content and better navigation.

Residents are encouraged to utilize the Web site's e-notification service to stay informed about meetings, services, programs and events.

The City of West Covina envisions the Web site becoming a destination for

The City of West Covina has also launched a mobile phone app that provides community information, including park locations and "Go West" shuttle routes and times, and it allows residents to report graffiti, potholes and other issues, all with the touch of a button. Apply for West Covina Ambulance Subscription Program

The West Covina Fire Department provides transport services through the Ambulance Subscription Program. Residents will continue to receive exceptional service with paramedics stationed throughout the city.

In addition to five paramedic assessment engines and a paramedic assessment truck company, three paramedic ambulances allow the West Covina Fire Department to offer innovative, flexible and quality service to the community.

These paramedic ambulances are assigned to stations 1, 2 and 4 and respond with the six paramedic assessment fire companies stationed throughout the city.

This program increases the number of paramedics on duty every day by one and helps to improve the quality of care, response times and overall service to the community.

Emergency medical care, paramedic service and efficient transportation have always been priorities for the West Covina Fire Department. The program's goal is to continually anticipate, evaluate and meet the changing needs of the community and provide the best possible service.

Dear residents,

Carolyn Arndt was named Citizen of the Year for her contributions to West Covina. The 57-year resident of West Covina has been involved with numerous volunteer activities, the most notable of which was her influence in starting the food bank movement in the 1980s.

Among her other deeds, Arndt reactivated the West Covina Improvement Association and has been a proponent to preserve open space in the community. Under her leadership, the Improvement Association has also volunteered to clean up Galster Park on weekends.

Van Dunahoo received the 2014 Historical Preservation Award for his longtime contributions to the West Covina Historical Society, as well as his work to promote and preserve West Covina's rich history for the education and enjoyment of all residents.



Do You Have an **EMERGENCY HOME ESCAPE PLAN?**

Imagine you are asleep in bed and awoken from the smell of smoke. What would be your first reaction? Would you and your family know what to do? How do you know if everyone inside the home made it out safely? These are a few questions the West Covina Fire Department would like you to ask yourself before a fire strikes your home.

Here are 10 tips you can use to protect yourself and your family before and during a fire.

- Develop a home escape plan - Family members should discuss what to do in case of a fire. A step-by-step plan is essential to ensure a safe escape.

- Know two ways out - Draw a floor plan of your home showing all possible

exits from each room. Plan a main escape route and an alternate escape route from each room, especially bedrooms.

- In a two-story home - Make sure everyone can unlock all locks and open all windows and doors quickly. Know how to escape safely from the second floor. If possible, arrange a ladder system.

- Install smoke detectors - Smoke detectors are the first line of defense during a fire. Every home must have at least one smoke detector for each floor where there are sleeping areas. Ideally, one detector should be in each bedroom. Place smoke detectors at the top of stairways leading to bedrooms and at the top of stairs leading from the basement.

- Get out fast - Make sure your family members know that if they hear a smoke detector or someone yelling fire, they must leave at once. Do not attempt to take any possessions while seeking safety outside of the structure.

- Test every door - Test every door for heat using the back of your hand. If the door or handle is hot, do not open the door. Use another planned exit.

- Crawl low in smoke - Stay close to the floor. Heat and smoke rise, so the air down low is the coolest

and clearest.

- Choose a meeting place - Designate a place outdoors for everyone to meet. Make sure someone calls 9-1-1 from a neighbor's house or a cell phone.

- Do not go back inside - Once outside of the home and at the meeting place, no one reenters the burning home. Firefighters are trained and equipped to handle rescue operations.

- Practice the plan - Conduct a fire drill at least once every six months. Get everyone to take part in the fire drill. Make sure everyone knows what to do. After the drill, discuss what took place and how to improve performance.





NOTICE OF STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD EMERGENCY REGULATION TO CONTROL WATER USE DURING DROUGHTS

New Water Restrictions In Effect Designed to Comply with State Mandate

San Gabriel Valley Water Company, Suburban Water Systems and all water utilities under the jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission have been ordered to notify customers of the State Water Board's restrictions and fines for violations of the Board's regulations. The emergency regulations call on all water users to sharply cut back on outdoor water use in response to severe drought conditions in California and Governor Brown's call for Californians to reduce water usage by 20 percent. Every resident of the state is responsible for complying with these regulations and your cooperation is needed to conserve precious drinking water.

The State Water Board has determined that the following outdoor water use activities by San Gabriel Valley Water Company's and Suburban Water Systems' customers are not allowed:



Watering outdoor landscapes in a way that causes water to "runoff" onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures.



Washing a vehicle, with a hose without a shut-off nozzle or other device that will immediately stop the flow of water when not in use.



Using drinking water to wash driveways and sidewalks.



Using drinking water in a fountain or other decorative water feature, except where the water is recirculated.

Violation of any of these four prohibited or restricted water use activities may be punished by a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500) for each day in which the violation occurs.

We want to thank our customers for doing their part and helping us through these dry times.






