
Exciting Times, New Faces for the West Covina Fire Department

In April, the West Covina City Council voted to accept the award of a Staffing for Adequate Fire & Emergency Response (SAFER) grant provided through the Department of Homeland Security.

This grant adds an engine company, additional staffing to the department's truck company, and an administrative assistant chief/fire marshal to augment the current resources protecting the City. In all, the grant will fund the addition of 13 new employees to the West Covina Fire Department for a period of two years.

The acceptance of the grant set into action a flurry of activity for both the Fire and Human Resources departments for the City. In addition to the recruitment of new firefighter/paramedics, the two departments had to also plan, organize, and carry out concurrent promotional examinations for both Fire Assistant Chief and Fire Captain.

All of the planning and hard work culminated with a badge presentation and promotional ceremony Nov. 1 at West Covina Fire Station No. 2. The ceremony was presided over by Interim Fire Chief

Larry Whithorn and was attended by members of the City Council, department directors, the honorees, and their friends and loved ones.

The new firefighter/paramedics include Sherard Flores, Justin Goodey, Matthew Briskie, Mac Rodesky, David Matyas, Kyle Hargrove, and Jonathan Covert.

After a competitive recruitment process, they also successfully completed a rigorous fire academy, which trains them in all aspects of their responsibilities with the fire department. Everything from fire station maintenance to fire ground survival is covered in depth.

With the recruitment and academy

behind them, they were all smiles as they were finally presented with their shiny new badges. Each firefighter/paramedic selected individuals important to them, who helped in attaining this career goal, to present them with their badge.

Also at the ceremony, six promotions were made within the West Covina Fire Department: Fire Captain Jim Rudroff to Assistant Chief/Fire Marshal, Firefighter/Paramedic Paul Krueger to Fire Captain, Fire Engineers Jason Robles and Brent Meier to Fire Captain, and Firefighters Peter Aguilar and Jeremy Mack to Firefighter/Paramedic.


DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

The General Plan's vision is long-range, supported by a spectrum of strategies and policies to deal with changing priorities and development pressures that the City will face through the coming years.

The General Plan is comprehensive in its scope, identifying community goals, policies and implementation measures regarding land use, transportation, housing, conservation, open space, noise, safety and other issues of interest to the community.

The City seeks community input to

craft a vision for the next 15 to 20 years. The City is encouraging public participation and input.

A number of Focus Groups have been formed to facilitate crafting a vision for the City. The Technical Advisory Committee meetings have been established to provide

guidance on the General Plan update process, and a series of speakers have been scheduled to provide perspective and tools to facilitate community input. Lastly, please save the date to participate in the Design Charrette scheduled for the last week of February.

CDC'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS BRING NEW BUSINESSES AND CITY REVENUES

The economic development efforts for 2014, lead by the West Covina Community Development Commission (CDC), have resulted in a year full of new and exciting businesses and projects. CDC promotes West Covina as the ideal location for business and cultivates a business friendly environment to attract and facilitate new businesses.

As a result of CDC's efforts, West Covina residents can enjoy new businesses such as Lucille's Smokehouse BBQ, ULTA Beauty, and Pier 1 Imports. These business and the many others CDC assisted have created over 650 new jobs in 2014 alone, are anticipated to generate \$567,000 in future annual Sales Tax revenues, and \$350,000 in future annual Transient Occupancy Tax to the City.

With all the new businesses, West Covina's vacancy rates in our shopping centers has fallen from last year's 7.8% to this year's 4.7%. West Covina's economic development efforts have been successful in attracting business to our City and West Covina's vacancy rate is lower than Los Angeles County (4.8%) and San Gabriel Valley (5.0%).

The new businesses make investments in West Covina which are reflected in the increase in property taxes. The City's overall property tax revenues (from residential and commercial properties) have increased by 5.4% since last year. West Covina's median price for a single family house has risen by 13.2%.

The additional revenues CDC helps generate go towards the City's general fund that pays for City services such as public safety (Police and Fire), city parks and facilities, youth and senior programs, community events, and public works (maintenance of our streets, sewers, etc.). CDC hopes residents enjoy the new businesses and patron them to keep our sales tax local.


