#### **'WALK OF FAME' AT BIG LEAGUE DREAMS**

The West Covina City Council in April approved the creation of a Walk of Fame inside the Big League Dreams Sportsplex to honor West Covina athletes, coaches and sports group volunteers who have made significant contributions to make West Covina a better place to live, work and play.

The Walk of Fame will include bronze plaques that will be inserted into the concrete walkways that transverse the Big League Dreams facility.

Nominations will be considered for individuals who are currently in, or have previously participated in, any athletic program – such as baseball, softball, golf, football, track and field, etc. – as an athlete, coach or volunteer. #### POOL SAFETY TIPS FROM FIRE DEPARTMENT

Too often, firefighters hear people say, "It was just a few seconds." Unfortunately, just a few seconds is all it takes for a child to drown. Drowning is the leading cause of death in California for children under the age of 5.

Most of these children drown in their own backyard swimming pools, but others drown in buckets, bathtubs, toilets, dog water bowls, canals and ponds. Small children are top-heavy, and they don't have the upper body strength to lift themselves out of one of these dangerous situations. Even if children survive these incidents, they are often left with permanent brain damage.

Drownings and near-drownings can be prevented, and you can help! Anyone involved with the supervision of children needs to be aware of the dangers associated with any body of water. Here are some useful tips to prevent these needless tragedies:

- Know where your children are at all times.
- Use an approved barrier to separate the pool from the house.
- Never allow children to be alone near a pool or any water source.
- Have life-saving devices near the pool, such as a pole/hook or a flotation device.
- Keep large objects such as tables, chairs, toys and ladders away from pool fences.
  - Post the 9-1-1 number on the phone.

- Do not allow children to play around the pool, and store all toys outside the pool area.
- If you leave the pool area, take the children with you.
- Always have a "designated child watcher."
  - Learn to swim.
- Never swim alone or while under the influence of alcohol or medications.
- Never swim when thunder or lightning is present.
- Never dive into unfamiliar or shallow bodies of water.

### -Be a Responsible Pool Owner

With summer just around the corner, the City of West Covina Public Works

Department would like to remind pool owners how to take proper steps for preparing residential swimming pools.

#### DRAINING A POOL


In order to remain in compliance with Environmental Protection Agency regulations and other City and County requirements, remember not to allow any swimming pool drainage onto the street or the storm drain system nor into a sewer manhole.

#### **VACATED POOLS**

There are specific requirements for filling in, or covering over a swimming pool the owner no longer wants:

- 1) A permit is required.
- 2) Break open six evenly spaced,

one-foot squares of concrete at the bottom of the pool to show dirt. This



- 3) Remove the first two feet of plaster from the top of the pool.
- 4) Call (626) 814-8415 for an inspection to ensure everything

was done properly.

5) Fill the pool. (If any future addition is going to be placed in this area, it is strongly advised that the dirt be compacted.)

#### FENCING AND PROPER ENCLOSURE

Pool owners should be aware of regulations concerning fencing and proper enclosure. A substantial, permanent fence is required to completely surround any and every pool or spa over 18 inches deep.

The State Swimming Pool Safety Act further requires that "Any pool for a single-family dwelling shall be equipped with at least one of the following safety features: a pool enclosure, an approved safety pool cover, exit alarms on doors leading to pool, or self-closing and latching doors leading to the pool." (Health and Safety Code Art. 2.5, Section 115920).

#### **2007 STATE LAW**

State law that went into effect in 2007 requires the installation of an anti-entrapment cover on the suction outlet of all pools and spas (Health and Safety Code Art. 2.5, Section 115928). To view the full text of this new law, visit the State of California Web site at www.leginfor.ca.gov.


# WEST COVINA CELEBRATES PUBLIC WORKS WEEK


#### Wins First Place!

♣ Aug. 6 – "Tovanger: The World of the Tongva." The Tongva, the indigenous people of the Greater Los Angeles area, return to tell their stories


about Tovanger (the world), social organization, technology, religion, language and their ancient villages.
