The U.S. Census Bureau has begun taking count of every person residing in the United States. There have been some changes this year to make it easier and quicker for residents to respond. There are only 10 questions, which can be answered in about 10 minutes. West Covina residents can play an important role by responding and mailing back the form. The responses tabulated from the questionnaires provide accurate updates about the West Covina population and our evolving profile.

First-time Home Buyer Program

FOR WEST COVINA HOME BUYERS

The Southern California Home Financing Authority and the County of Los Angeles are offering a program that includes homes in West Covina. It is called the Single Family Mortgage Revenue Bond Program.

This program is available for first-time home buyers with low and moderate incomes. The program provides a 30-year, fixed-interest loan of 4.7 percent with no down payment needed and a gift of 3 percent toward the down payment and closing costs. For more information, visit www.lacdc.org/schfa.

Bruce Shepherd to be Honored with Tree Planted in His Memory

n Arbor Day observance will be held Saturday, April 24 at 10 a.m. at Galster Park in West Covina. This event is presented by West Covina Beautiful and the City of West Covina in conjunction with Earth Day activities.

Each year during the Arbor Day observance, West Covina Beautiful pays tribute by planting a tree to honor a deceased person who, while living, contributed significantly to the community. This year, Bruce Shepherd is being honored.

Shepherd was a 25-year member of the Lions Club. He participated in the White Cane Vision Program, Flag Day for elementary school students, the Lions Club movie premieres and the November "Night on the Town" event.

Shepherd was also a volunteer for

the West Covina Police Department's SHOP (Seniors Helping Our Police) program, and he served the West Covina Unified School District for many years as principal of both Cortez and Vine elementary schools.

The National Arbor Day Foundation will

recognize the City of West Covina as

a "Tree City USA" for the 28th consecutive year. West Covina can be justly proud of this honor, as only a few other cities have received that

designation for more years than West Covina.

Boy Scouts of America Troop 433, whose scoutmaster is Dan Clewley, will present and retire the colors. A talented musical group from a West Covina school will entertain the audience with musical selections.

Help West Covina Firefighters 'Fill The Boot' for MDA

he Sixth Annual West Covina Fire Department "Fill the Boot" drive to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association will take place on Friday, May 7 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturday,

May 8 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Eastland Shopping Center and Westfield West Covina. Firefighters will ask motorists and passersby to drop donations into their boots.

Over the last five years, West Covina firefighters, with your help, have raised more than \$37,000 for the MDA. These funds provide health care and support services to children and adults living with neuromuscular diseases in West Covina and surrounding areas.

Additionally, MDA uses Fill the Boot dollars to fund scientific research

toward finding treatments and cures for the 43 diseases under the MDA umbrella. MDA programs are funded almost entirely by individual private contributions, such as those who drive by and "Fill the Boot."

The partnership between International Association of Fire Fighters and the Muscular Dystrophy Association began in 1954, and the fire service has remained the biggest champion of the MDA and

"Jerry's kids." Since its inception, Fill the Boot has raised more than \$350 million nationwide.

Everyone is encouraged to support West Covina's heroes as they "Fill the Boot" for "Jerry's kids!"



CLEAN-UP SATURDAYS

An Opportunity for Residents to Dispose of Unlimited Trash

Clean-Up Saturdays is an annual spring-cleaning event for residents and allows for unlimited disposal of household trash.

Clean-Up Saturdays operates on five consecutive Saturdays beginning April 17 for West Covina single-family residences serviced by Athens Services.


Residents of Los Angeles County unincorporated areas, apartments, mobile home parks and businesses are not eligible to participate.

Items eligible for pickup include household furniture, household appliances and bundled residential wood waste.

Items that will not be picked up include loose and broken glass, rocks, sod, broken asphalt/concrete, unbound vegetation, tires, auto parts, auto bodies, household hazardous waste and electronic waste items.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE ROUNDUP

Time to Dispose of Those Hazardous Waste Items

Some things are too toxic to throw into the regular trash! On Saturday, May 15 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the West Covina Maintenance Yard, 825 Sunset Ave., you can dispose of household hazardous waste and electronic waste, or "e-waste," the safe and right way.

Household hazardous waste includes paints, glues, pesticides, oils, solvents, cleansers, old medicine and dry-cell batteries, including those from vehicles.

E-waste includes such items as computer monitors, televisions, VCRs, stereos, fax machines,

computer keyboards and cellular telephones.

Improper disposal of these items can pollute the environment and endanger children and pets. Do your part to keep West Covina clean and green.

WEST COVINA RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT: MARK CATER, E-Z UP

ometimes all it takes is a great idea and a garage to make it a reality. Certain companies that have revolutionized the Internet and computer industries, including Google, Apple and

Hewlett Parkard, started with an idea and a garage.

Similarly, Mark Cater had an idea and his parents' garage in West Covina. At 20 years old, Cater's

frustration for the lack of a portable and instant shelter while under the blazing sun inspired him to design and build the easy-to-use pop-up tents known as E-Z UP Instant Shelters.

Cater started experimenting in his

parents' garage with a mechanical scissor truss system he had learned in high school. Initially producing one fold-up tent a day – while still going to college – Cater earned \$87,000 in

revenue. Working out of his parents' garage, he had minimal operating expenditures and was able to build his company with no working capital from the ground up.

The E-Z UP shelters

became instantly popular among different markets, including motor sports, movie studios, rental industry, parks and recreation, police, fire, highend corporate events, beachgoers, backyard entertainers and practically any outdoor activity.

Over the years, E-Z UP has grown to an international multimillion-dollar business, leading in its industry. From its humble beginnings in Cater's parents' garage, E-Z UP has located its corporate headquarters in Riverside, has a distribution facility in the Netherlands, and facilities in Canada, China and Mexico.

E-Z UP is still revolutionizing the tent industry and expanding its product line. The company continues to develop products for other niches from higherend outdoor furnishings – Bungalow product line – to environmental containment units used to control contamination in hospitals.

Congratulations, Mark Cater – you have made West Covina proud!

The City's new Web site has proven very successful. For the first three months since it went live to the public, the site received nearly 9 million hits! For the same period last year, the old site had fewer than 700,000 hits.
