BACKGROUND:

The Successor Agency (Agency) to the former West Covina Redevelopment Agency received a Finding of Completion (FOC) from the Department of Finance (DOF) on December 16, 2015. Shortly thereafter on December 18, 2015, the Agency also obtained DOF approval of the Long Range Property Management Plan (LRPMP), which include the disposition of properties previously owned by the former Redevelopment Agency.

On October 17, 2016, the Agency received an unsolicited Letter of Intent (LOI) from Singpoli Group LLC (Singpoli) for the development of three of the Agency properties located at the BKK Landfill site (130-acres), and rights to the area on the top deck the Agency has under license (84.27-acres) (see Attachment No. 1 for referenced areas). The three assets Singpoli would like to purchase for development are the following:

Pursuant to conversations with Singpoli, it indicated its intent to develop the site into an outdoor recreational park. At the time, Singpoli was partnering with Lan Kawi Fong Group (LKF) and

Mr. Tom Mehrmann. Singpoli is comprised of a variety of businesses that focus on real estate development, real estate brokerage, financial services (insurance agency & mortgage brokerage), architecture, construction, restaurant management, and a media network. Mr. Mehrmann and LKF Group have experience working on park development, specifically having experience working on Ocean Park in Hong Kong. Ocean Park is a combination of a marine mammal park, oceanarium, and animal themed amusement park.

On December 6, 2016, the City Council, acting as the Successor Agency, approved a 90-day Exclusive Negotiating Agreement (ENA) with Singpoli for the purchase of the Agency assets at the BKK Landfill site, and rights to the area on the top deck the Agency has under license.

On March 20, 2017, Singpoli, LKF, and Mr. Mehrmann, in a Closed Session City Council Meeting, made a presentation to the City Council concerning its interest in purchasing the property for possible development. City Council discussed the possible sale but requested more information. The Successor Agency approved a 90-day extension, which would have expired on June 4, 2017. Due to the time and resource commitment required to further conduct the due diligence of the proposed purchase, Singpoli requested an additional extension from 90-days to 180-days.

On May 16, 2017, the City Council, acting as the Successor Agency, approved an extension to the ENA with Singpoli. However, the ENA extension approved was through September 2017. On September 12, 2017, Singpoli made a presentation to the City Council in a Closed Session Meeting presenting a revision to its proposal with respect to acquisition of the property. At that time, Council did not extend the ENA and allowed the ENA with Singpoli to expire. Council requested that Singpoli make a presentation regarding its proposed development at a public City Council Meeting before additional discussions regarding sale of the site.

At the November 7, 2017 City Council Meeting, Singpoli presented its proposed project to the City Council. The City Council, acting as the Successor Agency, directed staff to host two community meetings with Singpoli to obtain additional feedback from the community. These meetings were held on December 4 and 6, 2017.

Singpoli's proposal includes a hotel, virtual reality park, horse training facility with event space and pavilion, horse barns and stalls, aerial adventure park (zipline), a solar and greenhouse program, and a K-9 unit and Fire Department training facilities (Attachment No. 2). The attached site plan of the proposed development project is preliminary and is being submitted for consideration by the City Council. The proposed development would feature a hotel with approximately 270 rooms and include 20,000 square feet of meeting space and banquet facilities on approximately 3-4 acres. Singpoli is proposing to build subterranean parking to maximize efficient use of the site's elevated surface area. In addition, the virtual reality (VR) park would encompass approximately 5-acres. The VR park has yet to be designed, but the building would be designed to be aesthetically pleasing on the exteriors and interiors and themed similar to Disneyland's ride "Soarin' Around the World" or Universal Studios "Harry Potter and the Forbidden Journey".

The proposed development includes a horse training facility the size of Arcadia's Santa Anita Park on top of the Class III landfill, which would include an event space and pavilion in the infield area of the track. The track would be for training purposes only; no formal racing or betting would be conducted on the site. As Santa Anita Park hosts events in the infield for family-friendly carnivals and cultural festivals, Singpoli is proposing to similarly take advantage of the infield space to enable a wide variety of events for the community to enjoy. To accommodate the Equestrian Center, the proposed development includes approximately 47 barns

with 1,400 horse stalls and an employee village including 264 dormitories with a cafeteria and recreation center. The zipline and aerial park would include ziplines and rock climbing. In addition, Singpoli proposes the installation of a trail from Big League Dreams to Galster Wilderness Park Nature Center along the property line to the Los Angeles County trail system in the City of Walnut. Lasty, Singpoli is proposing a K-9 unit and Fire Department training facilities.

While the Class I landfill is not part of the Agency property, Singpoli is considering opportunities for the site. Singpoli has included a solar greenhouse, a new concept of a solar farm with agriculture below. New solar technology allows solar panels to be translucent enough to allow sunlight through. As it is a common use for landfills to have solar farms, this new technology allows additional use of the site. The solar panels act as the roof to the greenhouse, allowing agriculture to grow in raised planters so as to not disturb the landfill cap. The solar panels also collect rainwater that can be used to water the plants/crops in the greenhouse. As the site is a former landfill, there would be measures taken to ensure the safety of the food grown on the site. Singpoli would partner with a proven solar energy developer for this component of the project.

DISCUSSION:

As directed by the City Council, staff coordinated two community meetings; one held on Monday, December 4, 2017 at the Cameron Community Center and the other on Wednesday, December 6, 2017 at Shadow Oak Park (both started at 6:30 p.m.). The community meetings included a presentation by the City regarding the status of the former redevelopment agency properties, a presentation by Singpoli, followed by a Q&A session. The intent of the community meetings was to obtain community feedback on the proposed development. The community meetings were attended by a total of over 170 residents and stakeholders at both meetings combined. At the meetings, the community members provided feedback, from concerns regarding the proposed development, support for various component of the proposed project, to suggestions for amenities not included in the proposal. Some of the suggested amenities included a soccer complex, basketball courts, and other sports facilities for the community.

To further pursue the project, Singpoli requested to enter into an Exclusive Negotiation Agreement (ENA) for the purchase of the properties. The ENA would provide Singpoli and the City time to negotiate the terms of the sale and a disposition/development agreement. If Singpoli wishes to include portions of the landfill site not owned by the Agency, it would have to negotiate separately with the owners of those properties. Singpoli, as well as the City of West Covina, and the Successor Agency, would need to negotiate/renegotiate agreements already in place with regulatory agencies pertaining to the environmental regulations and conditions of the former landfill site (United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), and among others). In addition, any proposed development project would have to go through the proper procedures to obtain federal, state, regional, and local approvals including the City's entitlement process and the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements.

As part of the ENA, Singpoli will consider the feedback received by the community and assess its proposed development to see what it can incorporate into the project. While Singpoli would like to incorporate all the comments by the community, it will need to ensure the project remains feasible both physically and economically.

On December 19, 2017, the City Council approved an ENA between the City of West Covina and Singpoli to further pursue the feasibility of the proposed project and negotiate the price and terms of a Development and Disposition Agreement (DDA) for the site. The term of the ENA is one hundred eighty (180) days and requires Singpoli to meet with four regulatory agencies; DTSC, Los Angeles County Regional Water Board, CalRecycle, United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The ENA will offer Singpoli the opportunity to conduct necessary studies on the property and develop a conceptual development site plan and elevations.

The attached proposed development is preliminary and subject to change based on environmental factors associated with the site being a former landfill, mitigation measures required pursuant to the site's post closure plan, obtaining approval from the regulatory agencies, obtaining approval from the property owners, and City approval of the development project.

It is important to note that any studies or analysis done for the Singpoli project will be shared locally.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that the Oversight Board receive and file this report.

BACKGROUND:

The Successor Agency (Agency) to the former West Covina Redevelopment Agency received a Finding of Completion (FOC) from the Department of Finance (DOF) on December 16, 2015. Shortly thereafter, on December 18, 2015, the Agency also obtained DOF approval of the Long Range Property Management Plan (LRPMP). As a result, the Agency is proceeding with implementing the LRPMP including the disposition of assets listed for sale. The LRPMP included thirty two (32) properties, twenty six (26) which are Government Use Transfers to the City, and six (6) listed for sale.

In July 2006, the Community Development Commission of the City of West Covina (CDC) sold a portion of parcel 12 and all of parcel 13 (now referenced as pads 700 and 750) to M&A Gabaee (Gabaee) for the development of a commercial/retail/office project. As part of the Purchase and Sale Agreement (Agreement) dated July 13, 2006, Gabaee was responsible for the cost, installation and completion of all public infrastructure (road, curb, gutter, sidewalk, sewer, and utilities for proposed commercial development of the 700 and 750 pads), including upsizing the improvements as necessary to support the proposed golf course and clubhouse from the "stub-out point". In addition, pursuant to the Agreement, Gabaee was responsible for paying the cost of the water system as well as coordinating installation of such improvements with the water purveyor Suburban Water Systems, including the water tanks to support the 700 & 750 pads, and the proposed golf course and clubhouse. To help facilitate the installation of the water system, the CDC granted use of the retained parcel 12 (now assets #28 and #29) for the use by Gabaee to construct the water tanks and water pipes. Suburban Water and Gabaee had been working on a final design of the water tank system.

In June of 2016, Gabaee submitted an offer letter, to purchase the two Public Water Tank Assets #28 and #29 for a total of \$85,500. The appraisal, conducted in April of 2016, took into

consideration the restraints on the property, including the Agreement with Gabaee for use of the site for the water tanks as well as the environmental restriction for open space.

On June 20, 2017, the Agency authorized the Executive Director to execute a 180-day Exclusive Negotiation Agreement (ENA) with Gabaee for the sale of the two Agency parcels. Subsequently, on June 22, 2017, the West Covina Oversight Board (OB) authorized the ENA for the sale of the two Agency parcels to Gabaee. At the meeting, the Oversight Board requested a second appraisal to be conducted for the two Agency parcels. Staff hired BTI Appraisal, who valued the two parcels combined at \$60,190 (appraisal dated August 29, 2017). Gabaee kept its offer of \$85,500. In addition, the OB wanted to see a site plan of Gabaee's proposed development.

The development concept Gabaee is proposing includes two six-level Class-A office buildings with multi-level parking structures below the buildings (Attachment No. 1). The two office buildings combined total approximately 400,000 square feet with Building 1 at 239,140 square feet, and Building 2 at 154,794 square feet. Gabaee is working with Suburban Water Systems to develop a schematic for the proposed water tank system that is to be constructed for the use of Gabaee's project and upsized to provide water for the Agency assets.

DISCUSSION:

The Agency and Gabaee entered into the 180-day ENA on June 20, 2017. Gabaee was required to provide a good faith deposit of \$15,000, development site plans, and elevations. During the ENA period Gabaee engaged in substantial progress towards finalizing the purchase of the two Agency parcels. Prior to the expiration of the 180-day ENA on December 17, 2017, Gabaee submitted a request for a 90-day extension to the ENA in order to continue negotiations with the Agency for the purchase of the Agency parcels. On December 19, 2017, the City Council denied the request for an ENA extension.

While the ENA has expired, staff will continue to work with Gabaee on the sale of the two assets.

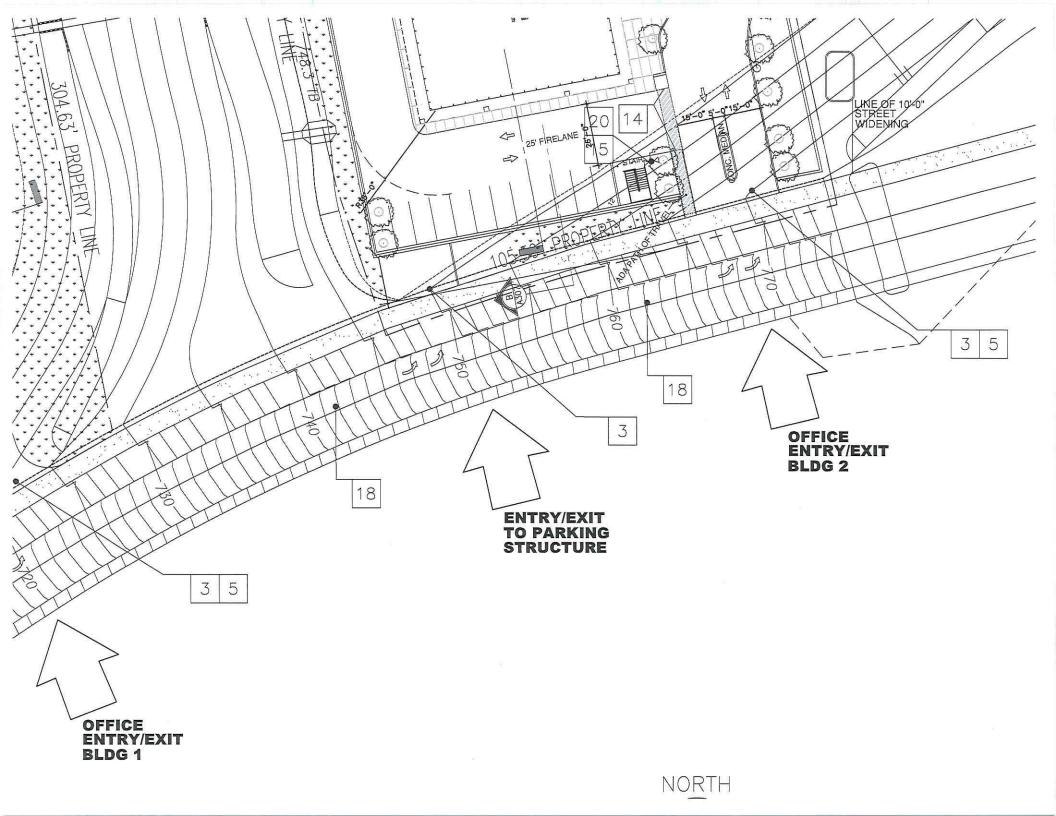

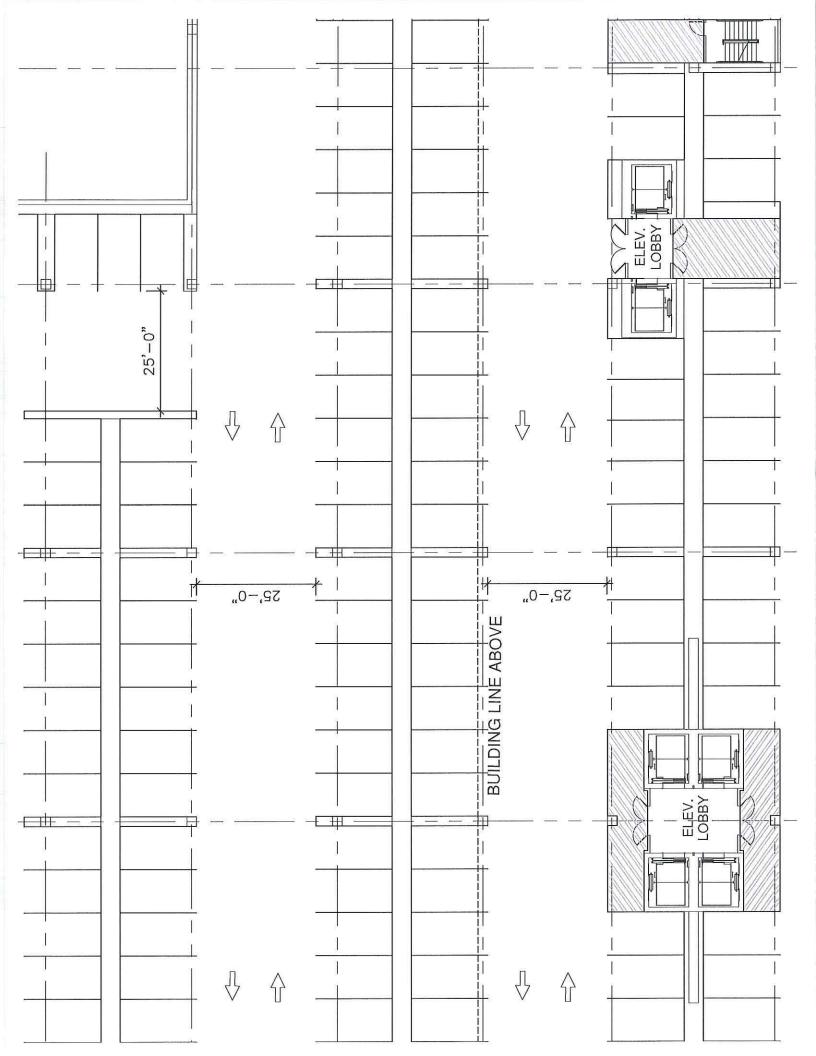

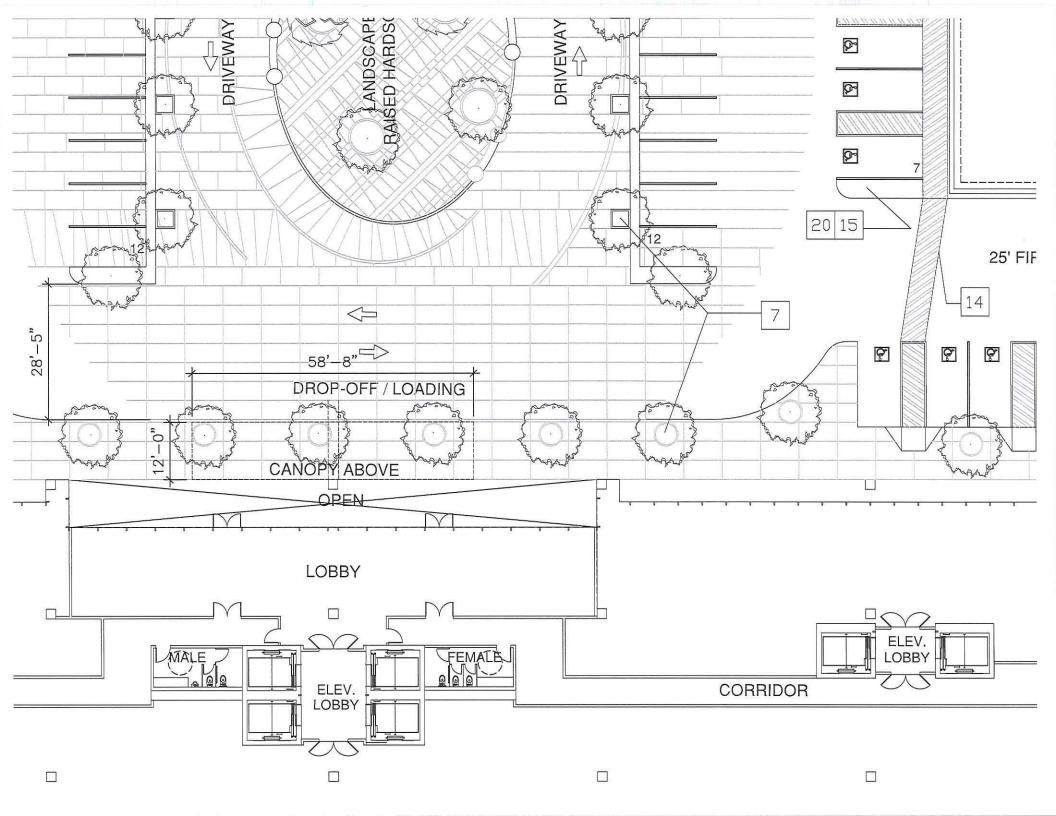
Attachment No. 1 – Site Plan of Proposed Project

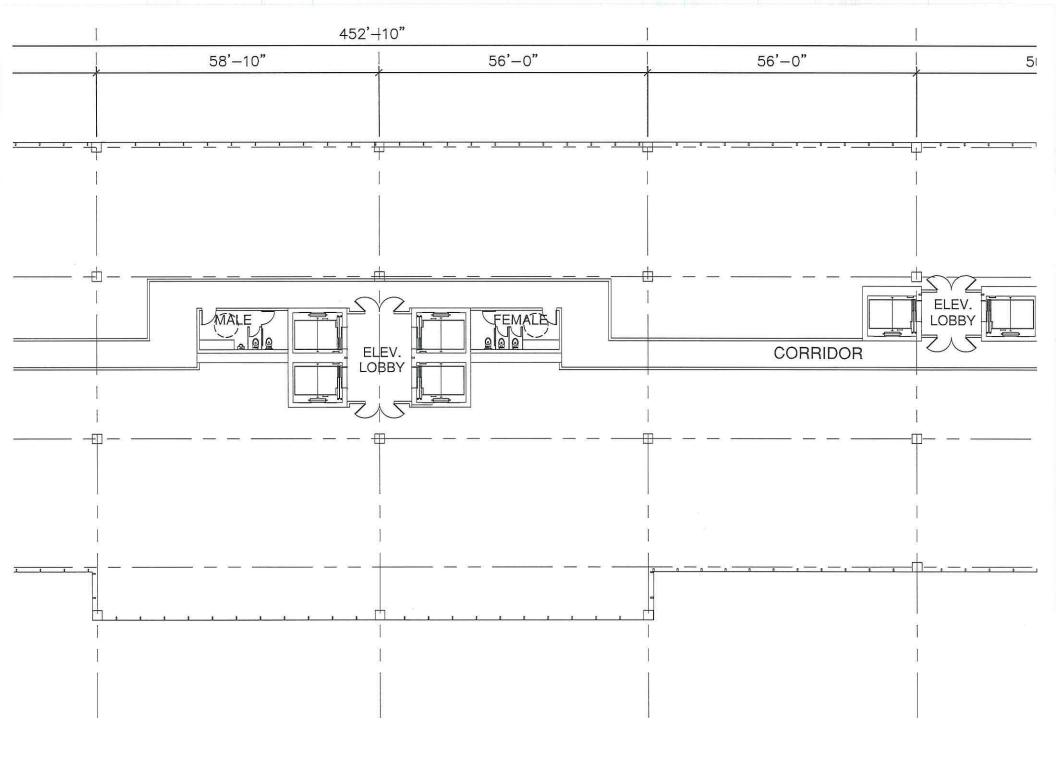

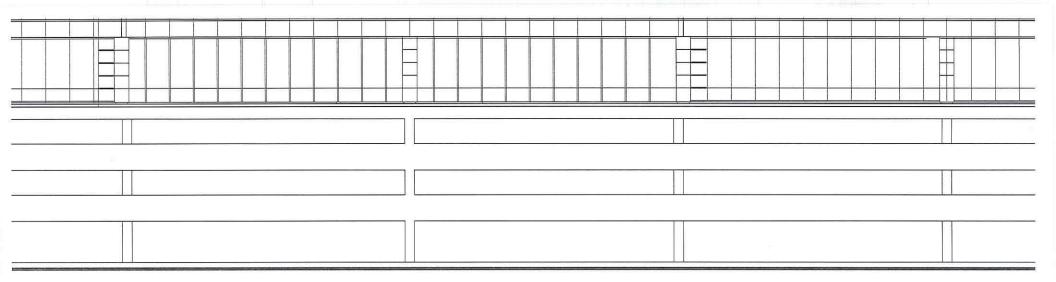






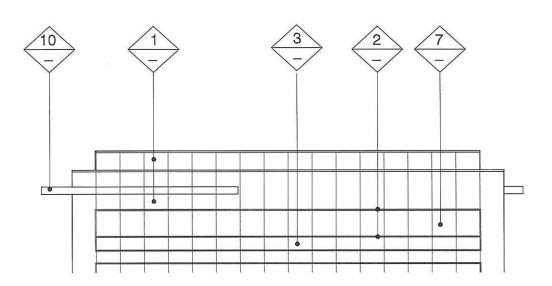


2ND-6TH FLR PLAN (BLDG 1)



WEST ELEVATION (BLDG1)

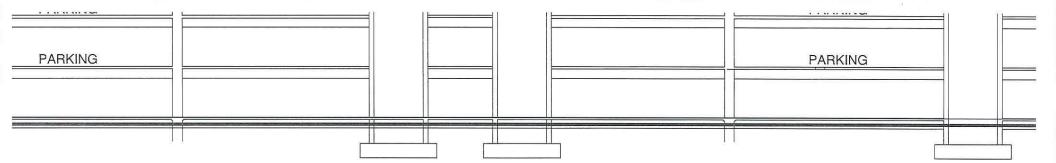

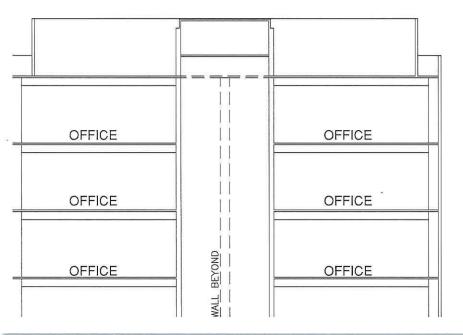

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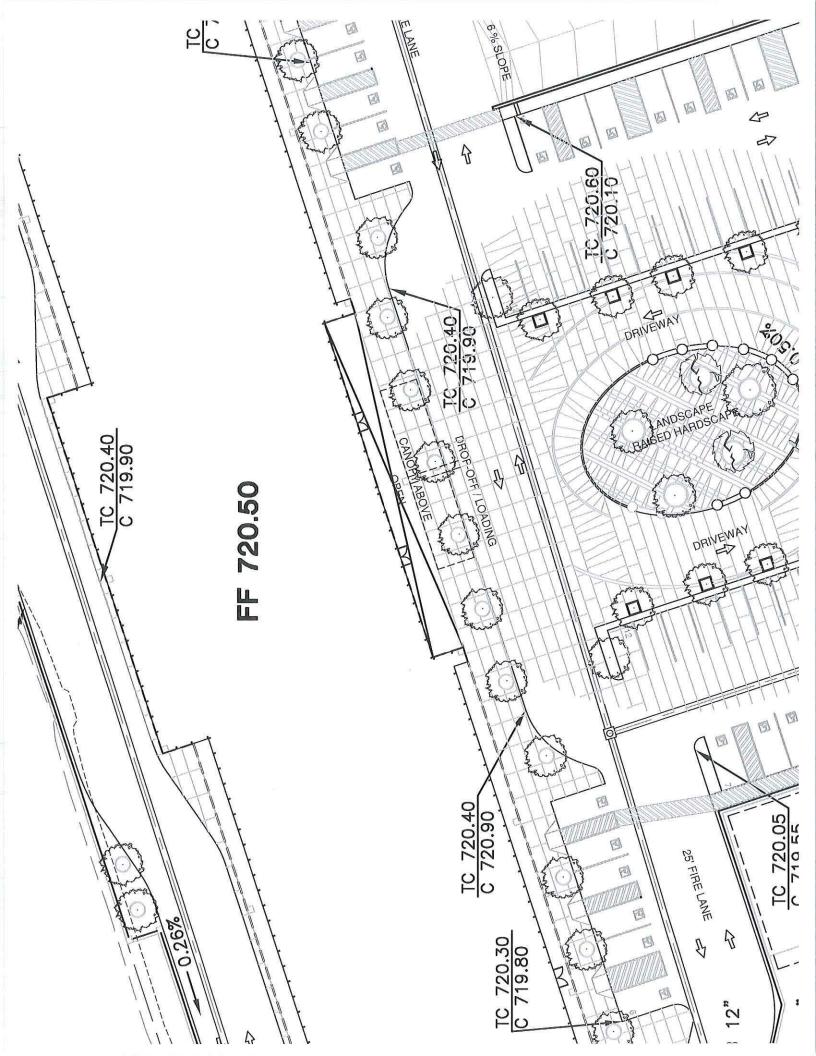
EAST ELEVATION (BLDG1)

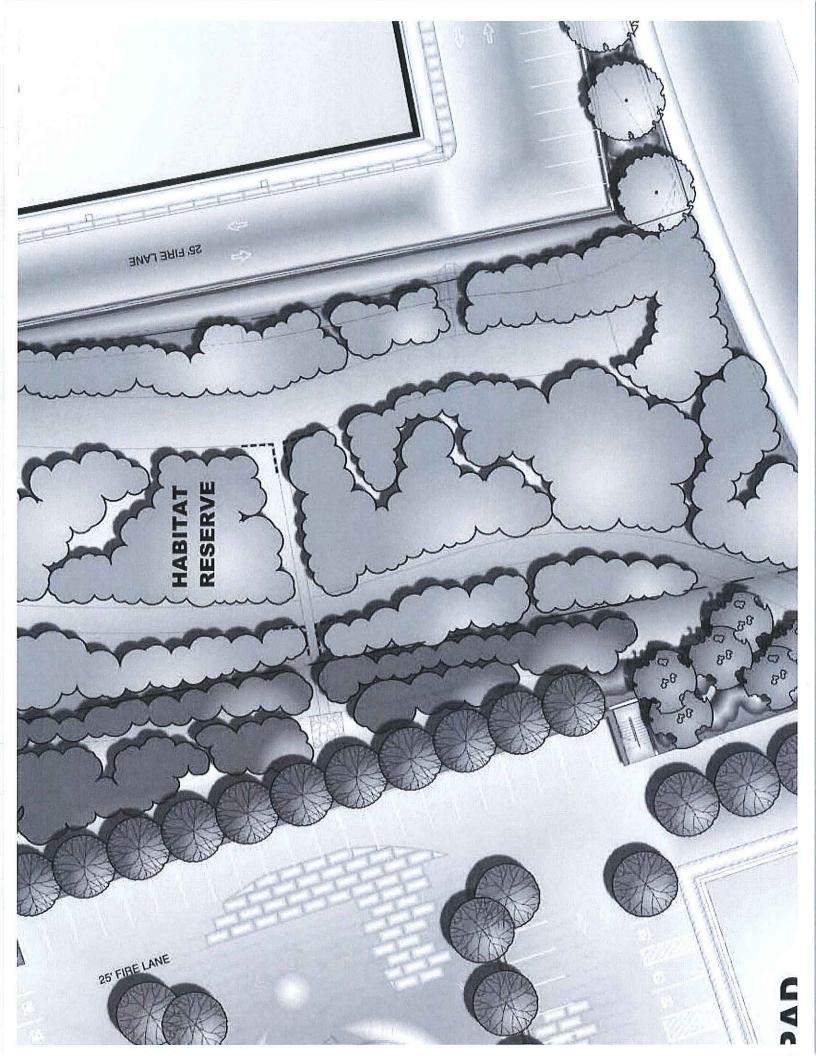

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Oversight Board to the Successor Agency to the former West Covina Redevelopment Agency, adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. OB-0056 – A RESOLUTION OF THE OVERSIGHT BOARD TO THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE FORMER WEST COVINA REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE TRANSMITTAL OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET AND A RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE "ROPS" FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2018 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2019

BACKGROUND:

In accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 34179.7(O)(1), the Successor Agency is required to file a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) annually in order to receive a distribution of property tax increment dollars with which to fund the obligations of the former Redevelopment Agency. These obligations include bond debt service payments, amounts due under existing agreements with commercial property owners, repayment of amounts borrowed from the Housing Fund to fund property tax shifts mandated by the State, cost of litigation to protect assets of the former Redevelopment Agency, repayment of loans to the City, and administrative costs of the Successor Agency to wind down the affairs of the former Redevelopment Agency. While many of these listed items are not necessarily debt, they are considered obligations for purposes of this mandated report and must be listed on the ROPS if they are to be funded by distributions of future tax increment dollars. These items are not debt obligations of the City of West Covina.

DISCUSSION:

The ROPS schedule (Attachment No. 1 – Exhibit A) lists all amounts that will be paid for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. Once the ROPS is approved by the Oversight

Board, it then must be forwarded to the State Department of Finance (DOF) by February 1, 2018. DOF holds final approval authority of the items listed on the ROPS and directs the Los Angeles County Auditor-Controller to distribute tax increment funds to the Successor Agency. Many of the obligations listed on the ROPS are estimates, i.e. variable rate debt service payments, litigation, etc.

The Oversight Board is also required to adopt an administrative budget for each annual period. Attachment No. 1 — Exhibit B to this report is the administrative budget for the Successor Agency for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. This budget is to be funded by the administrative allowance, which is 3% of the enforceable obligations, after loan payments, or \$250,000 annually; whichever is greater. The City will absorb any administrative costs above this administrative allowance. These administrative costs can also be found in the ROPS (Attachment No. 1 — Exhibit A) line item nos. 12, 20, 21, 54 and 91.

The total amount of funding requested for enforceable obligations from the Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund (RPTTF) on ROPS 18-19 is \$10,584,587 and includes many of the same items that have been previously approved by DOF.

Other new items added to the ROPS include:

Item #141 – 2017 Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds – Since the Successor Agency refinanced several of its outstanding bonds, line item #141 has been added for the 2017 Refunding Bonds trustee administrative costs.

LEGAL REVIEW:

The Oversight Board Counsel has reviewed and approved this staff report, resolution and the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Successor Agency cannot receive or spend any funds unless the amounts are listed on a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule. This schedule identifies all outstanding obligations that must be satisfied before the Agency can be dissolved. The obligations listed on this schedule will receive property tax allocations distributed by the County of Los Angeles as their funding source.

If the Successor Agency's administrative costs exceed the administrative allowance, the excess expenditures will be absorbed by the City.

A RESOLUTION OF THE OVERSIGHT BOARD TO THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE FORMER WEST COVINA REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE TRANSMITTAL OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET AND A RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE "ROPS" FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2018 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2019

WHEREAS, as part of the 2011-12 State budget bill, the California Legislature enacted and the Governor signed, companion bills AB1X 26 and AB1X 27, requiring that each redevelopment agency be dissolved unless the community that created it enacts a resolution committing it to making certain payments; and

WHEREAS, on December 29, 2011, the California Supreme Court upheld AB1X 26, which dissolved all of the redevelopment agencies in the State of California as of February 1, 2012, and struck down AB1X 27; and

WHEREAS, at a meeting of January 10, 2012, the City of West Covina took action to designate itself as the Successor Agency to the former West Covina Redevelopment Agency; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179.7 (o) (1), commencing with the ROPS covering the period from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019, agencies shall submit an oversight board approved annual ROPS to the State of California Department of Finance and the Los Angeles County Auditor-Controller by February 1, 2016 and each February 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the West Covina City Council, acting as Successor Agency to the former West Covina Redevelopment Agency, reserves the right to appeal any determination of the State of California Department of Finance or other entity regarding the propriety of this resolution as well as any future determinations; and

WHEREAS, the West Covina City Council, acting as Successor Agency to the former West Covina Redevelopment Agency, intends to comply with the state-mandated obligations established hereunder; and

WHEREAS, all other legal prerequisites to the adoption of this resolution have occurred.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Oversight Board to the Successor Agency to the former West Covina Redevelopment Agency, as follows:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference, and constitute a material part of this Resolution.

SECTION 2.
