Homelessness is a crisis that impacts those who experience it, neighborhoods, businesses, and communities.


Homelessness is solvable.



What do we know about homelessness

Many people experiencing homelessness do not have significant challenges such as severe mental illness or substance use disorders. The majority are homeless because of economic issues specifically housing and the high cost of living. Only a portion of people face issues such as mental illness and substance use disorders, however they can be quite visible in public as many of those who struggle with these challenges are sleeping outside.

Only 30% of people in the San Gabriel Valley are considered **Chronically Homeless** meaning that they have lengthy homeless history and a disability.



72% of households assessed for housing and services in West Covina need limited short term financial assistance and support.

10% need very minimal assistance and should
be able to end their
homelessness on their own.

Every night there are over half a million people experiencing homelessness across the country



Nearly a quarter of the nation's homeless population is in California, with LA accounting for a large portion of that group



There are 4,292 people experiencing homelessness in the San Gabriel Valley with **277 living in West Covina** according to LAHSA's 2018 homeless count

Homeless impacts on businesses

Concerns about homelessness's impact on businesses, property values, and crime can be a source of confusion and frustration in communities. If you are the owner or operator of a local business, you may be concerned about trespassing, vandalism, or theft directly effecting your business; or be concerned that the presence of loitering, litter, or aggressive panhandling may deter customers.



You have rights.

For instances of abandoned property, excessive trash, or outdoor storage of property, call the West Covina Code Enforcement Hotline at (626) 939-8426.

If you witness drug activity,
trespassing, aggressive
panhandling or activity that
impedes access to businesses,
call the West Covina Police
Department at (626) 939-8500.

If you are concerned for your or someone else's **immediate** safety, dial 911.

It is not illegal for someone to sit or lie in a park or other public space. However, trespassing on private property, blocking a sidewalk, littering, loitering, vandalism and other acts may be illegal. If you would like to report a crime or suspected crime that is not an emergency, consider calling the West Covina Police Department directly at (626) 939-8500.

Proactive steps your business can take

Many nuisance and criminal complaints can be prevented with simple proactive actions you can take to protect your property or business such as:

- Ensure that doors and windows are properly locked
- Post "No Trespassing" signs on your property
- Ensure adequate lighting
- Install fencing to control access and improve safety

- Consider private security measures such as installing security cameras or an alarm system, or partnering with neighboring businesses to hire a security guard
- Secure trash enclosures by contacting Athens Services at (626) 336-3636 to order locks for commercial bins
- Remove excess foliage or debris
- Increase the presence or visibility of staff on site



As a business owner you can also be a great resource for helping homeless individuals and families get employed. Consider:

- Partner with local homeless programs to potentially provide job opportunities for individuals and families in their programs.
- Partner with local homeless programs to provide job training or internships.
- If you are member of The Greater West Covina Business Association or other groups encourage other local businesses to provide employment or job training activities.

Know where to point people who are experiencing homeless to receive employment services and job training. In the San Gabriel Valley there are several workforce centers that provide employment assistance:

Employment is a key strategy in the federal plan to prevent and end homelessness



Many people who are homeless want to work, and in fact, nationally between 10-20% of the homeless population is employed.



Many people become homeless because they simply cannot afford a place to live.



Without a stable job and steady income, it can be almost impossible for a homeless person to get back on their feet.
