City Manager's CORNER

Homelessness is an issue that cities throughout California continue to address while navigating the ethical, political and legal challenges. The City of West Covina has seen a three-year increase in its homeless count (2019 data pending), balancing legal rights of homeless individuals and public safety for the community at-large. The City has continued to be creative in funding programs and services while minimizing the impact to the General Fund, and staff continue to advocate for more Measure H funding to be used at the local level, in support of the County-wide effort to mitigate homelessness. The City has continued to foster partnerships and collaborations with various agencies in homeless services and law enforcement in order to better address this complex issue. While some of our partnerships and programs are highlighted on page 5, the newest collaboration will be launching in June/July 2019. I am proud to announce that the City of West Covina was successful in securing \$343,250 from Measure H grant funding for a five-person Housing Navigator team in partnership with the Cities of Azusa, Covina, Duarte and Glendora. This five-person team will be working in our community and in our neighboring partner cities providing outreach and case management to ensure homeless individuals have access to supportive services and housing. This team will compliment the work being done by our Homeless Outreach and Park Enforcement (H.O.P.E.) Team from the Police Department, as well as the other service providers and regional partners currently working to improve homelessness in West Covina and the region. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the residents who diligently report issues in the community and advocate for improved processes and positive change at public meetings. I urge the business community to continue to work with your Service Area Lieutenants and Code Enforcement to address issues on private property as we understand the challenges and want to support your businesses so they can be successful. Together we can make a lasting impact to reduce homelessness and improve the quality of life in West Covina.

ENROLL IN POLICE DEPARTMENT'S "CITIZENS' ACADEMY"

A new session of the Citizens' Academy program is starting soon, giving participants an up close and personal look at how the West Covina Police Department operates. Class members will observe aspects of police operations including patrol, investigations, forensics, SWAT, K9 operations, and more. Classes are free and will be held every Monday evening at the 1st Floor Community Room at City Hall from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. for ten consecutive weeks beginning April 1st. HOMELESS OUTREACH AND ENFORCEMENT EFFORTS IN WEST COVINA

Much of California is experiencing an increase in the homeless population. The City of West Covina is constantly pursuing opportunities and resources to target homelessness, and will continue to do so. Here are the programs that the City currently dedicates to this homeless issue.

• Homeless Outreach and Park Enforcement (HOPE) Team

In 2017, using a combination of grant and local funding sources, the City created 2 full-time Police Officer positions to focus on homeless related calls for service throughout the City, and also provide targeted law enforcement at City parks. To date, the HOPE Team has removed over 100 illegal encampments and given hundreds of service cards to help the homeless population access available services and assistance in our region.

• East San Gabriel Valley Mental Evaluation Team (MET)

In 2015, the Police Departments of West Covina, Covina, Azusa, and Glendora partnered with the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health to create a combination mental health and law enforcement team. One day per week, a licensed Mental Health Clinician partners with a West Covina PD Officer, handling calls and reaching out to people suffering from mental health issues, helping them access mental health and social service programs.

• Homeless Assistance Liaison Officers (HALO)

The East San Gabriel Valley HALO Team is a regional homeless outreach program funded by the State, that brings together local police departments and LA County's "SB 82" Mental/Homeless Team. Each month, the West Covina Police Department assigns an Officer to work with this team, offering assistance to the homeless with social services, veterans' benefits, housing options, and also addressing criminal activity.

• Union Station Partnership

New for 2019 is a partnership with Union Station that will see a parttime homeless outreach worker in West Covina 2-3 days per week, to help the homeless navigate housing and services. This is pilot project funded by a grant.

Although being homeless is not itself a crime, if a homeless person commits any crimes, the Police Department will respond and enforce the law, and we ask you the residents to always report any crimes you see, by calling 9-1-1 (for emergencies) or (626) 939-8500 (for non emergencies), or by visiting www.wcpd.org.

Earthquake Preparedness

Drop! Cover! Hold On!

HOW TO SAVE YOURSELF DURING AN EARTHOUAKE







DROP where you are, onto your hands and knees. This position protects you from being knocked down and also allows you to stay low and crawl to shelter if nearby.

COVER your head and neck with one arm and hand

- If a sturdy table or desk is nearby, crawl underneath it for shelter
- If no shelter is nearby, crawl next to an interior wall (away from windows)
- · Stay on your knees; bend over to protect vital organs

HOLD ON until shaking stops

- Under shelter: hold on to it with one hand; be ready to move with your shelter if it shifts
- No shelter: hold on to your head and neck with both arms and hands.

Protect Yourself During Earthquake Shaking!

Official rescue teams from the U.S. and other countries who have searched for trapped people in collapsed structures around the world, as well as emergency managers, researchers, and school safety advocates, all agree that "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" is the appropriate action to reduce injury and death during earthquakes. Earthquakes occur without any warning and may be so violent that you cannot run or crawl; you therefore will most likely be knocked to the ground where you happen to be. But If possible, take cover away from exterior walls of a building which are the most dangerous places to be. Windows, facades and architectural details are often the first parts of the building to collapse. To stay away from this danger zone, stay inside if you are inside and outside if you are outside.

Given the dynamics of earthquakes and their effects on structures, "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" is the single most useful instruction that you can follow to protect yourself in the majority of situations. It gives you the best overall chance of protecting yourself during an earthquake... even during quakes that cause furniture to move about rooms, and even in buildings that might ultimately collapse

AMBULANCE SUBSCRIPTION PROGRAM

Now available for local businesses!

Here is how the program works:



Cost: \$69 (per residential household) or \$69 (for every 10 employees in a local business) located in West Covina.

Benefits: Membership lasts 12 months, provides unlimited ambulance transports (with no co-pay), and will waive the \$289 EMS Assessment Fee (charged when treatment is provided but the patient is not transported).

ATTENTION ALARM OWNERS



If your monitored alarm system is designed to summon the Police or Fire Department, you are required to sign-up for an annual alarm permit (\$10 per permit, per system).

Background: Each year, the Police and Fire Department respond to thousands of alarm calls where 95% result in a false alarm. Responding personnel do not know the names of the occupants or whether hazardous materials are located on-site. Alarm permits will ensure information is provided to responding personnel.

Goal of the program: To create a balance between the use of Police and Fire Department resources to respond to alarm calls while holding the alarm monitoring companies accountable for alarm system installations and the alarm owners accountable for the operation and maintenance of their alarm system.

Exclusion: Residential smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors do not require an annual alarm permit.

HOUSING PRESERVATION LOAN PROGRAM

The Housing Preservation Loan program provides West Covina homeowners a low-interest home improvement loan up to \$10,000.
