

CURB MARKINGS AND PARKING



Parking regulations and curb markings are guided by the California Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CAMUTCD) as well as the California Vehicle Code (CVC) and City's Municipal Code.

Meanings of Curb Color for Parking

RED CURB indicates no stopping, standing, or parking at any time, whether the vehicle is attended or unattended. A bus however may stop in a red zone if marked or a sign is posted as a bus zone.

YELLOW CURB indicates no stopping, standing, or parking any time between 7:00am and 6:00pm of any day except Sundays and holidays for any purpose other than the loading or unloading of passengers or materials. The loading and unloading of passengers shall not exceed more than three (3) minutes and the loading and unloading of materials shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes.

WHITE CURB indicates no stopping, standing, or parking for any purpose other than the loading or unloading of passengers which shall not exceed three (3) minutes between 7:00am and 6:00pm of any day except Sundays and holidays.

BLUE CURB indicates parking limited exclusively to the vehicles of disabled persons and disabled veterans. Parking spaces for the physically challenged are also found in city owned parking lots throughout the city. A blue zone may be installed by formal application by an engineering review and approval by the Traffic Commission and City Council:

- Applicant is in possession of distinguishing license plate or placard,
- On-street location is needed for access.
- Off-street parking is not available at a residence or business.
- Applicant understands that the blue zone will be available to all qualifying members of the public and does not constitute reserved individual parking.

How to request new parking or loading zone restriction

Public on-street and curbside parking is not owned by residents or businesses. The Engineering Division will investigate all requests from residents and business owners for modification of existing parking restrictions and the installation of new parking restrictions if they are deemed necessary. Red curbs in residential areas will not be installed unless an engineering study determines there is a line of sight issue.

To request a special parking provision or curbside markings, you must do the following:

1. Submit a request detailing the exact location of request and reason for wanting a change and submit to the City at traffic@transtech.org.
2. The city will then make an initial investigation to the request for green, white, yellow, or blue curbside.

The requester may need to provide a petition to the City showing that adjacent business owners and residents are in favor of installation.
